

We're doing wood pole inspections and maintenance in your area.

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May 3, 2018

Attention Town of Osler,

To keep customers and employees safe and help provide reliable power, we'll soon be in your area to do inspections and maintenance on wood power poles and rural transformer services.

This work involves looking for damage, signs of decay and carpenter ant infestation. Where we can, we repair or reinforce the pole to extend its life and keep it in service. If we can't repair or reinforce it, the pole will be replaced or the powerline will be rebuilt.

Crews will stay within the SaskPower right-of-way as much as possible, but workers may occasionally need access to private property in certain cases. No power outages are necessary for this work.

The schedule for 2018 is:

- May 7 to late July – Rural areas around Saskatoon, including Martensville, Dalmeny and Warman.
- May 7 to late August – Weyburn and area, including Francis, Sedley, Radville and Lake Alma.
- August to September – Saskatoon city
- August to late October – Preeceville and area, including Sturgis, McBride Lake, Stenen, Norquay, Pelly and Lintlaw
- Late August to late October – Meadow Lake and area, including Greig Lake, Pierceland, Green Lake, Lac Des Iles Hingers Resort, Lauman's Landing, Lac Des Iles Silver Bay, Lac Des Iles Christel Beach, Pierce Lake Howe Bay, Loon Lake and Makwa

This work can be affected by weather and crop conditions, so the schedule may change by a couple of weeks.
